



Roulette

How to play:

Long played by the European aristocracy in Monte Carlo, roulette is quite simple to play and enjoy.

The Roulette Wheel has 36 numbers plus a “0” and “00.” The numbers are alternately colored red and black, except for the zeros, which are green.

Players place their bets on the layout on the numbers corresponding with the ones on the Roulette Wheel. The dealer then spins the wheel counterclockwise and the ball clockwise. When the ball drops into the winning number and comes to rest, the dealer marks the winning bets with the dolly and then clears all the losing bets and pays all the winning bets.

Each player receives different colored chips to avoid confusion. These chips have no value on any other game and must be cashed in before leaving the table.

Players can make a variety of wagers at the same time for a chance to get multiple payoffs. A wager on a single number is called “straight up.” A wager on two numbers is called a “split.” It’s a “street bet” for three numbers and a “corner” for four numbers.

Dealers are happy to explain the placement of any bets, but the players are responsible for the correct position of their wagers on the layout, regardless of whether they or the dealer have placed the bets.

Bets and Odds

- A** 5 Numbers (1, 2, 3, 0 & 00. Pays 6 to 1)
- B** Corner (Play all four numbers. Pays 8 to 1)
- C** Row (Play all three numbers in a row. Pays 11 to 1)
- D** Even or Odd (Pays 1 to 1)
- E** Split (Play any adjoining two numbers. Pays 17 to 1)
- F** Red or Black (Pays 1 to 1)
- G** Dozen (Play 1 - 12, 13 - 24 or 25 - 36. Pays 2 to 1)
- H** Straight Up (Play any number including 0 & 00. Pays 35 to 1)
- I** 6 Numbers (Play all six numbers in the two rows. Pays 5 to 1)
- J** 1 to 18 or 19 to 36 (Pays 1 to 1)
- K** Column Bet (Play all 12 numbers in the column. Pays 2 to 1)
