THE BASICS

Mississippi Stud is a five card poker game that lets players bet up to 10 units on a single hand. Players compete against a payable rather than the Dealer, and win if their hand is a pair of 6s or better.

HOW TO PLAY

Players make an Ante bet to receive their first two cards. The Dealer will place three community cards face down in the middle of the layout. Once they receive their cards, players may either fold or make the 3rd Street bet of one to three times their Ante. The Dealer will then reveal the first community card, and players may either fold or make the 4th Street bet of one to three times their Ante. The Dealer will then reveal the second community card, and players can either fold or stay in the game by making the 5th Street bet from one to three times their Ante. Note: when a player folds, they forfeit all bets left in action.

After the Dealer turns over the final community card, they resolve all the bets left in action. Players win if their five card hand is a pair of Jacks or better (pair of 6s to 10s push). Winning hands are paid according to the schedule below.

3 CARD BONUS SIDE BET

The 3 Card Bonus side bet is based on the three community cards only. The 3 Card Bonus will receive action regardless if the Player folds their hand. If the Player has placed a wager on the 3 Card Bonus side bet and folds, the Dealer will remove the original MS Stud wager(s) and tuck the folded cards under the Player's 3 Card Bonus side bet. Players win with at least a pair or better.

HAND RANKINGS & PAYOUTS

Royal Flush	500 to 1
Straight Flush	100 to 1
Four-of-a-Kind	40 to 1
Full House	10 to 1
Flush	6 to 1
Straight	4 to 1
Three-of-a-Kind	3 to 1
Two Pair	2 to 1
Pair of Jacks or Better	1 to 1
Pair of 6s to 10s	PUSH

3 CARD BONUS

Player Hand	Payout
Straight Flush	40 to 1
Three-of-a-Kind	30 to 1
Straight	6 to 1
Flush	3 to 1
Pair	1 to 1
